



WHAT: The Festival of the Arts celebrates student achievement in the visual arts. We provide a festival venue for our whole community to enjoy the talent and efforts of CNUSD art students.

WHERE: The Arts Colony (TAC) gallery and grounds at Corona Heritage Park, 510 W. Foothill Pkwy, Corona, CA. Heritage Park upholds the history of Corona and simultaneously acts as a hub for current community events and organizations celebrating the arts and unique facets of our shared past.

HIGH SCHOOL ART SHOW PROSPECTUS

ELIGIBILITY: CNUSD high school students (grades 9-12) enrolled during the 2022-2023 school year. Each art teacher may enter up to 10 student artworks. In addition to 10 entries, art teachers may submit one additional piece within the “Most Promising Newcomer” category (see below). Each student may exhibit only one artwork for the entire show, regardless of having more than one art teacher. Artwork initiated and completed during the 2022-2023 school year.

CATEGORIES: Each 2023 entry must assign to one of the following categories and be judged among other pieces within that category. Select categories based upon the actual work and not course titles.

- **Drawing in Black & White:** graphite; black pen and ink; charcoal.
- **Drawing in color:** colored pencil; colored pen and ink; oil or chalk pastel; watercolor pencil.
- **Painting watercolor/tempera:** watercolor on paper; tempera on board or paper.
- **Painting acrylic/oil:** acrylic or oil paint on canvas, board, or paper.
- **2-D/3-D Mixed Media:**--open to all mediums, 2 or more art mediums must be used in one piece.
- **Graphic Design (Fine Art)** - artwork created using Photoshop and/or Illustrator, such as digital illustrations, surrealistic designs, paintings done in Photoshop, digital collages, etc. in which the student did not originate the photographic foundation/content.
- **Graphic Design (Production/Business)** - designs such as logos, fonts, book covers, posters, packaging, invitations, album covers, magazine covers, etc.
- **Digital Photography:** Straight digital image shot in-camera with no major post-processing. Color correction, cropping, black and white conversions, and basic retouching allowed.
- **Manipulated Photography:** Original, student-initiated, digital image with edits that incorporate digital processing (i.e. Photoshop) to create an altered image, such as a composite or any added element that was not present with initial image production.
- **Ceramics Utilitarian:** functional glazed and fired pieces.
- **Ceramics Sculpture:** decorative glazed and fired pieces.
- **Sculpture/3-D design:** Work viewed in the round, non-utilitarian, open medium; single medium.

- **Video Short Film:** Must be under 5 minutes; all genres accepted with appropriate content.
- **Music Video:** Must be under 4 minutes; all music genres accepted with appropriate content.
- **Most Promising Newcomer:** This entry is not part of the larger competition. Each teacher may nominate one entry-level student piece for this category, which may be in any medium. The goal of this category is to recognize and encourage students who are new to the arts and may not be ready to compete with advanced students. We hope to encourage students with potential to pursue the arts.

ENTRY GUIDELINES:

- **All hanging artwork must be framed and wired – no exceptions, please (protective covering such as glass or plastic recommended)**
- Work may not exceed 18 x 24 inches in length or width.
- Subject matter acceptable for public viewing
- All work of lasting quality and complete (not in process)
- All video entries for each school site must be saved onto one USB-A flash drive
- Entry Label must attach to the back of all artwork for gallery acceptance

ONLINE ENTRY FORM:

- Please enter all work online (www.cnusd.k12.ca.us/artsfestival) by **WEDNESDAY, March 15, 2023.**
 - On the website (www.cnusd.k12.ca.us/artsfestival) go to the button labeled “**Submission Form Student Artwork 2023.**” This will direct you to an MS office form.
 - Fill out the form for each individual piece of art you are submitting to the show.
 - Note: Only CNUSD Art Teachers may submit Student works.
 - **Fill out the form** with:
 - Artwork Title
 - Artist Name
 - Artist Student ID #
 - Select the appropriate category from the drop-down menu for School Level
 - Select the appropriate High School you are submitting from the drop-down menu.
 - Select the appropriate Category you are submitting to from the drop down menu.
 - Upload a JPEG of the Artwork.
 - If you are submitting video, you can upload a MP4 or .MOV file as well.

DELIVERY OF ARTWORK:

- Deliver artwork on Wed. **March 22nd** & Fri. **March 24th** between 7:45am – 4:30pm
- Deliver artwork to The Arts Colony (TAC) Gallery at Corona Heritage Park, **510 W. Foothill Pkwy, Corona, CA, 92882.**
- Although all care will be taken, CNUSD, TAC, and Festival coordinators cannot be held responsible for loss or damage to any artwork. Please securely frame and wire all hanging artwork.

JUDGING CRITERIA & AWARDS:

- Originality
- Presentation
- Composition
- Use of medium/media
- Judges select three (3) outstanding entries in each category. A single artwork judged to best exemplify the judging criteria out of all high school entries will be awarded **BEST OF SHOW**.
- Winning entries will display ribbons in the gallery after judging.
- Entries will stay on exhibit throughout the duration of the show.

RETRIVAL OF ARTWORK:

- Artwork can be picked up SAT. **April 1st** AFTER THE SHOW IS OVER AT 2PM.
- Individuals responsible for artwork pick-up must sign a confirmation form before leaving to avoid misplacement of student submissions.
- Artwork not claimed on April 1st , will be delivered to the CNUSD District Office Building D, and may be retrieved there the week of April 10th – 14th 2023. The office is open from 8AM – 4:30PM daily. ARTWORK MUST BE PICKED UP BY **APRIL 14TH** AT THE LATEST.
