## WHO ARE WE?

Eleanor Roosevelt High School (ERHS) is a comprehensive high school in the Corona-Norco Unified School District within Riverside County, California. ERHS opened its doors in 2006 and currently has an enrollment of 4,613 students. The school's 62-acre campus is nestled in a growing suburban city, Eastvale, which is located in the greater Inland Empire region. The 2016-2017 school year welcomed the first class of freshman to the Eastvale STEM Academy and the three-story eSTEM facility opened on the ERHS campus during the 2019-2020 school year.

Over the last sixteen years, Eleanor Roosevelt High School students have made their mark in various national and state academic award programs such as the National Merit Scholarship Program, the Gates Millennium Scholar program, Girls and Boys State, the prestigious Questbridge College Matching Program, and advancement to the California State and International Science and Engineering Fair. In addition, ERHS has been recognized as one of the Best High Schools in the United States by US News & World Report.

In 2017, ERHS partnered with our local community college, Norco College, to offer Dual Enrollment college courses on our high school campus. Students are taking full advantage of earning college units while completing their high school requirements. We have an average of 250 students enrolled in the Dual Enrollment program in any given semester.

## ERHS MISSION STATEMENT

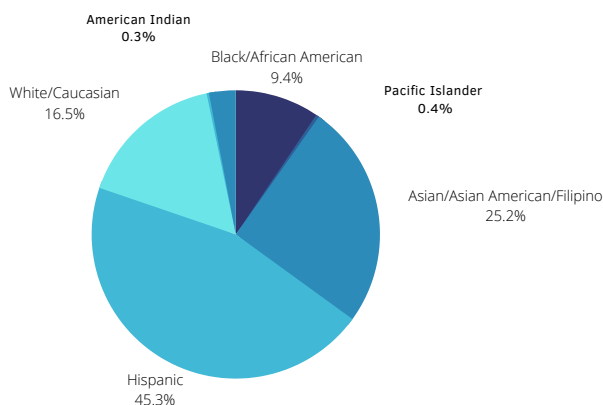

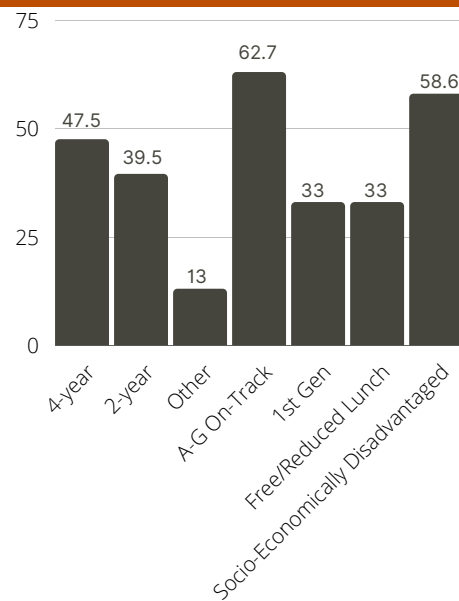

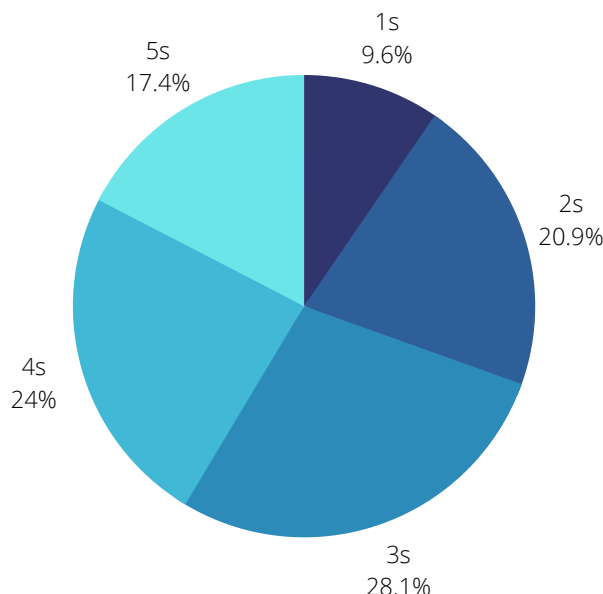

### TRANSCRIPT DATA

**Middle School:** Math or World Language courses taken in middle school are not reflected on the transcript.

**Community Service:** not required for graduation.

**California's AB104:** This bill in part allowed for students to change A-D grades to a Pass (P) and F grades to a No Pass (NP) for the 2020-21 school year. Courses changed from letter grade to P/NP no longer factors into the GPA. Students/Families had from August 3-17, 2021 to submit a form for this request. ## DUAL ENROLLMENT

In partnership with our local community college, Norco College, we offer college-level courses to our students on the ERHS campus. These courses are general education courses that fall under the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) pattern for University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU) transferability.

These courses differ semester-by-semester. We currently offer courses in English, Math, Life Science, Business, Communications, Arts, Social Sciences, Childhood Development, Administration of Justice, and Guidance.





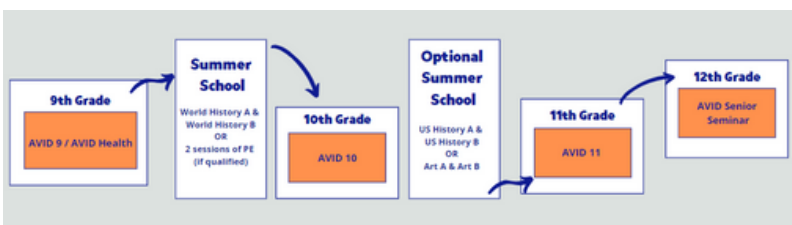


## PROGRAMS

### AVID

AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) is a nonprofit that changes lives by helping schools shift to a more equitable, student-centered approach. AVID's mission is to close the opportunity gap by preparing all students for college readiness and success in a global society. ERHS has 9 AVID teachers, 2 AVID school counselors, and 1 AVID administrator.



### STEM

The Eastvale STEM Academy is a specialized program that offers a rigorous curriculum with CTE courses for students interested in the STEM fields. The program offers three pathways: medical science, engineering, and computer science.

When enrolled in the STEM program, students can expect a learning experience that takes the processes of critical thinking, problem solving, innovation, and collaboration integrated into the curriculum of real-world science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.
